Introduction



ICT transformed classroom environment

Author's 12 years of online learning use and experience

Teaching: process of attending to people's needs, experiences and feelings, and intervening so that they learn particular things (Smith, 2018)

Learning: *the transformative process of taking in information that—when internalized and mixed with what we have experienced—changes what we know and builds on what we do (Bingham & Conner, n.d.)*

ICT: devices, networking components, applications and systems that combined, allow people and organizations (i.e., businesses, nonprofit agencies, governments) to interact in the digital world (Rouse, n.d.)

ICT: *leveraged for economic, societal & interpersonal transactions/interactions...individuals moving from personal, face-to-face interactions to ones in the digital space...ushered Fourth Industrial Revolution (Rouse, n.d.)*



ICT in education: mode of education that use information and communications technology to support, enhance, and optimize the delivery of information

Increase in the use of ICT in education with integrating technology to curriculum has significant and positive impact on students' achievements (Aoki, 2010)

Students continuously exposed to technology through education - better 'knowledge', presentation skills, innovative capabilities, and are ready to take more efforts into learning as compared to their counterparts (Aoki, 2010)

Online learning - education that takes place over the Internet... **Catalyzes pedagogical shift in how we teach and learn**... **Shifts away from top-down lecturing and passive students to more interactive, collaborative approach** in which **students and instructor co-create the learning process** (Stern, n.d.)... Facilitated through ICT

Components of a successful online learning (Pallof et al, 1999)

1. Access to technology;
2. Guidelines and procedures;
3. Participation;
4. Collaborative learning;
5. Transformative learning or learning about learning, technology and oneself; and
6. Evaluation of the process.

Synchronous learning

...

Can be done online via live webinars, instant messaging, and virtual classrooms

...

Collaborative and feedback-friendly

...

Asynchronous learning

...

Can be completed through online courses, email, blogs, pre-recorded videos or webinars, online discussion boards

...

Learners complete courses in their own time and regardless of location

...

Synchronous learning

- takes place in real-time,
- group of students engaged simultaneously,
- learning occurs at the same time,
- enables learners to ask questions and receive answers on-the-spot,
- collaborates freely with their co-learners.





Synchronous learning

PROS

High interaction with instructors and other learners

Feedback is immediate

Learner questions can be answered instantly

Asynchronous learning

PROS

Offers flexibility as learners go at their own pace

It's cost effective - no travel, venue, or instructor costs

Scales training as you can train thousands of learners at once



Synchronous learning

CONS

Learners adhere to a specific training schedule and can't access content where and when they like

Some learners may feel they're not receiving the individual attention they need

Quality of the sessions depend on the instructor

Asynchronous learning

CONS

Contact through asynchronous learning may be limited

Leaves some learners feeling isolated

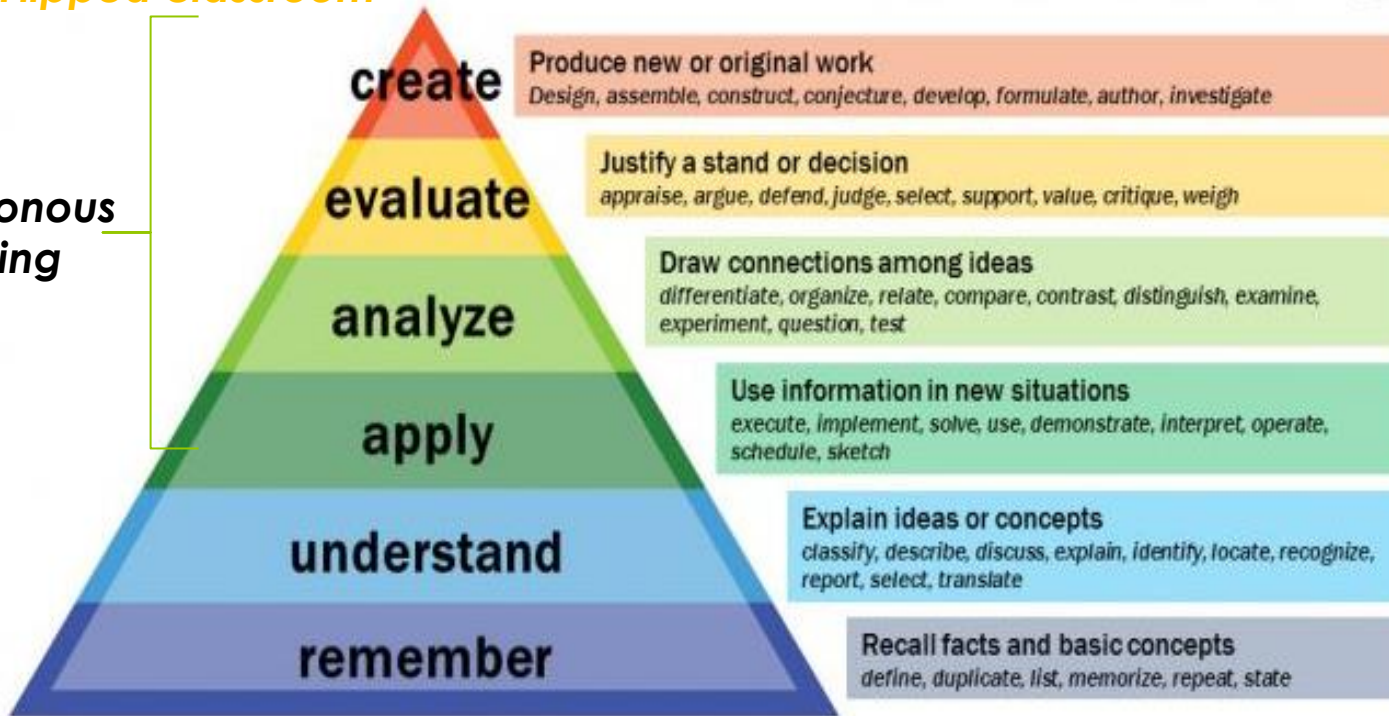
Learners need to be self-disciplined and motivated to complete their courses

- ✓ Chat

- ✓ Email

- ✓ Short Quizzes



Asynchronous Delivery is best for:

- Uploading resources & assignments
 - E-books
 - Powerpoint slides converted to pdf
 - Interactive videos
 - Videos from Youtube and other sources

Students can download these anytime and view them multiple times



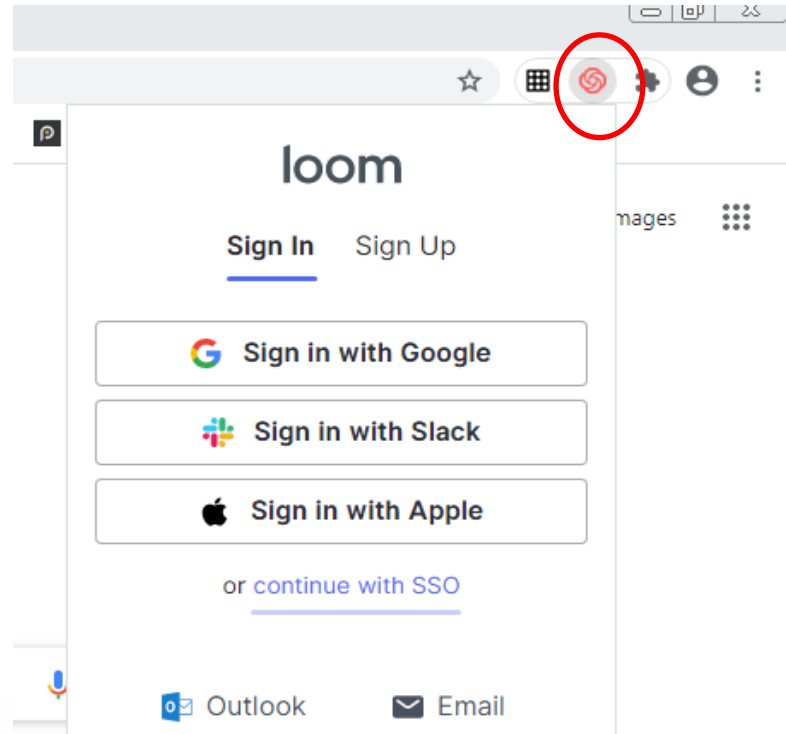
Recording Lecture Discussions

- Powerpoint slides with recorded narration
 - Common presentation tool
 - Easy to use, software familiarity
 - Built-in animations and transitions
 - Allows you to edit narration per slide
 - Export it as video
 - Upload it in mySOUL, Google Drive or Youtube



Recording Lecture Discussions

- Loom



- Google Chrome – Apps – Web Store – Extensions - Loom



Recording Lecture Discussions

- Loom
 - Easy to use screen recording capability
 - Internet –dependent
 - Options available: Screen only, Screen and Video
 - Video trimming capability
 - Uploaded in Loom and share the link in class



Recording Lecture Discussions

- Smartphone
 - It's the most available tool!
 - Upload video on mySOUL, Google Drive or Youtube



Using Forums

- Allows you to post questions for everybody to discuss
- Forums allow public and private replies
- Replies to forums can be sent to your email address



Using Forums

- Forums can be graded
 - ✓ class participation
- Some students are more comfortable typing their answers than talking



Using Chat & E-mail

- Chat sessions are recorded and can be reviewed anytime
- Students can send private chats for inquiries, clarifications about the subject matter



Using Chat & E-mail

- Email notifications can be enabled when private messages are sent
- Email can be sent and received anytime



Using Short Quizzes

- Pre-test
- Post-test



Benefits

- Students learn at different times
- More convenient / flexible for both students and teacher
- Students can participate on their own time
- Location independent (can access anywhere as long as internet is available)



Benefits

- Internet-speed friendly
- Lesser use of internet data
- Students are less discouraged -> enjoys online learning



Tips

- ✓ Post schedule per week/ month
- ✓ Create a Forum for Announcements
- ✓ Orient students with the types of activities that you will be using



Tips

- ✓ Discuss your virtual classroom policies
- ✓ Record your video conference sessions and share your link to the class
- ✓ Use the mySOUL mobile app
